Mr. Carter, born July 3, 1893, in North Branch, Kansas, came to Palmdale in 1923. He operated a "teaming business" with horses until 1930 when he became an employee of the Palmdale School District, where he remained until his retirement.

He was a past president of the Palmdale Kiwanis Club and past president of the then Palmdale Irrigation District . . . now Palmdale Water District . . . in the days when PID was a dominate factor in development of the South Antelope Valley. He was active in the early Palmdale Community Presbyterian Church and other early community organizations and programs; was currently associated with the First Baptist Church and a member of the First Friends Church of Pasadena.

Mr. Carter is survived by his widow, Mrs. Florence Carter of the Palmdale family home; a son, Howard C. Car-

ter of Glendale; two granddaughters, Mrs. Lynn Mason of Portland, Ore.; Miss Elaine Carter of Glendale, and a great grandson, Jeremy Matthew Mason of Portland.
